

First and foremost, I want to recognise the contributions and sacrifices of a total of about 2500 people that were involved in the overall preparation and organising of the Games. Everybody worked very hard for the success of APMG 2018. You are all amazing - Thank you!

The organising team had only 21 months to prepare for the first-ever Asia Pacific Masters Games in Penang. It has to be noted that most hosts are given four years to prepare. The time constraint did not set us back as we attracted 5601 participants from 64 countries, surpassing the 5,000-target.

I want to thank YAM Tunku Imran Tuanku Ja'afar, who recommended Penang as hosts to the International Masters Games Association. As the APMG 2018 honorary ambassador, he played a huge role in promoting the Games. Special thanks also to Dato Low Beng Choo, whose continuous support in her role as the technical advisor was invaluable to the Games.

The Minister of Communication and Multimedia YB Gobind Singh Deo, Deputy Minister of Youth and Sports YB Steven Sim and Deputy Minister of Tourism, Arts and Culture YB Muhammad Bakhtiar Wan Chik all took special interest in APMG 2018, and played their own roles to ensure the Games received nationwide coverage and recognition.

The support of the Penang Island City Council, Malaysia Convention & Exhibition Bureau (MyCEB), Olympic Council of Malaysia, various government departments, private companies, sports partners, councillors, technical officials, officials and volunteers ensured the successful organisation of the Games.

Our sponsors and partners played a vital role in supporting APMG 2018. Although the Penang state government provided RM4.5mil and another RM2mil was collected from registration fees, it was not enough to cover all costs of hosting an international sporting event with 22 sports. A RM500,000 cash sponsorship by Zenith Ewein and approximately RM3mil in cash, kind and service from the other sponsors and partners helped to cover all expenses with a marginal profit declared.

Through the hosting of APMG, development fund for state sports associations and RM2.2mil worth of equipment has been acquired for sports in Penang. The equipment includes a new timing system for MBPP Swimming Complex, a resurfaced running track at City Stadium, a new mountain bike trail in Relau, a removable basketball court with scoring system, training mats for pencak silat, archery target butts and training balls for team sports like football and volleyball. I believe hosting APMG 2018 has provided Penang with valuable experience to host more international events in the future and to promote our tourism, hospitality, food, culture and heritage site. Executive Summary



The Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 in Penang, Malaysia set a new milestone by being the first-ever multi-sport Masters Games to be held in Asia. With the growing culture of more people of Masters age embracing healthy lifestyle and activities, it was the right time for the most populous continent in the world to hold its own Masters Games.

The APMG 2018 organisers faced big challenges, but managed to clear every hurdle to put on an inaugural Masters Games in Asia which everyone can be proud of. The main target set for the organisers was to enrol at least 5,000 participants for the Games. When the registrations closed, the final number stood at 5,601 total participants, signalling a victory for the organising team. Of this number, 3328 participants (59.4%) are Malaysians, with 1796 from Penang and 1532 from the rest of the country. There were 2273 international participants (40.6%) from 64 countries, with India (385), Australia (296), Japan (240) and China (179) having the largest foreign representations at the Games.

Besides marketing and promoting the event, the APMG 2018 organisers had to reach out and educate the masses on the Masters Games concept. The understanding about Masters Games was very low among the public in the South East Asian region, including Penang and Malaysia. Much time and effort were spent on creating awareness regarding the competition, and to break the general local mindset that international sporting events are only for youth or high-performance athletes. APMG 2018 succeeded in drawing newcomers to Masters Games, and helped form a new sporting culture for those who are of masters age groups.

The APMG 2018 Torch Run which began in April 2018 and traversed all the 13 states and three federal territories in Malaysia added to the fanfare and awareness about the main event. During the Games, all the 22 sports in the APMG 2018 calendar were conducted and completed successfully.

The co-ordination and support from all parties concerned, including the Penang State Government, the Penang Island City Council and the Malaysia Ministry of Tourism and Culture, ensured the successful running of the Games from 7-15 September 2018. The success of APMG 2018 will pave the way for more international Masters events to be held in this region.

Governance

The International Masters Games Association was concerned over the lack of a multi-sport Masters Games event in Asia. As the most populous continent in the world, there is a vast potential to develop and popularise Masters sports in the region.

The Asia Pacific Masters Games was created in particular to cater for the growth of Masters sports in Asia. The term Pacific was included to tap into the vast existing market in the Pacific region, in particular Australia.

In 2015, the Penang Government through a bid team assisted by Malaysia Major Events, a subsidiary of the Malaysian Ministry of Culture and Tourism, won the right to host the inaugural Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018.

The Penang Government identified the Asia Pacific Masters Games as an event that would generate numerous community benefits, particularly in the areas of tourism and sports. The Asia Pacific Masters Games Penang 2018 Organising Committee was set up to organise the event.

Medal Rationale

The lanyard's design is based on the flower from the tree 'Penaga Laut' or its scientific name *Calophyllum inophyllum*. Penang was once known as Tanjong Penaga. It was named after the tree Penaga Laut. The tree was mostly planted at Padang Kota Lama. Its flowers fragrant and white in colour, occur in clusters and are striking amongst the striking dark green foliage of the tree.

Medal engraving services were provided at selected important venues, including at the Penang City Stadium, which housed the Games headquarters and also the venue for athletics' track and field events.



Volunteers

The success of the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 requires a large workforce, including volunteers from the public and private sectors, non-governmental organizations, recreation clubs, tertiary-level students, schoolchildren and 'orang asli' (aboriginal natives).

The volunteers from Intel Corporation Penang made the most significant contribution from the private sector in terms of manpower support. The Intel volunteers contributed a total of 2,600 hours in service across five sports – swimming, pencak silat, basketball, wushu and taekwondo during APMG 2018.

From the public sector, the biggest group of volunteers was from the Penang Island City Council (MBPP). The MBPP played a huge role especially in the successful staging of the opening and closing ceremonies and the athletics competition.

A group of 18 orang asli youths from Pahang, Perak and Kelantan also assisted as volunteers at the APMG secretariat during the Games. The group were taking part in the orang asli youth volunteer programme initiated by the Malaysian Ministry of Youth and Sports and under the guidance of Deputy Youth and Sports Minister YB Steven Sim. The programme was created with the aim of providing useful exposure to orang asli youths and to help them blend in with the various communities in Malaysia.

The volunteers selected to perform the tasks assigned needed to know clearly what their assignments are and realise their responsibilities in implementing them as best as they can. The volunteers carried the image of the Games throughout the event. Volunteers' behaviour and ethics were embedded in the hearts of every volunteer.

The volunteers were placed at the various venues to assist during the sports events and the opening and closing ceremonies.

The Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 Penang opening ceremony on September 8 2018 at the iconic City Stadium in George Town, the oldest stadium in Malaysia, created several firsts in the history of Masters Games.

It heralded the official start of the first-ever multi-sport international Masters Games to be held on Asian soil. It was also the first time ever that a nationwide torch run, which culminated with the cauldron-lighting ceremony during the opening ceremony, was held at a Masters Games event.

The event was also the first time that a Masters Games opening ceremony had been broadcast live on national television. With the assistance of the Communications and Multimedia Ministry, the Malaysian public broadcaster Radio Televisyen Malaysia provided live coverage of the APMG 2018 opening ceremony on its TV2 channel.

An estimated 1,500 participants took part in the Opening Ceremony Run, which served as a prelude to the start of the opening ceremony programme. A total of 5,564 athletes, 1,067 officials and over 1,000 volunteers and 1,000 performers were involved in the opening ceremony programme.



The official opening ceremony commenced at 8.30pm following the arrival of the Yang Di-Pertua Negeri (Governor) of Penang, Tun Dr. Abdul Rahman Abbas. The Penang Chief Minister Chow Kon Yeow and the International Masters Games Association president Kai Holm were among the dignitaries present at the event.

The Games was declared open by Tun Dr. Abdul Rahman Abbas. The lighting of the Games cauldron was done by a quartet of ex-national athletes from Penang - Dato' Zaiton Othman, Cheng Chu Sian, and Saik Oik Cum and PLBS Peyadesa. N. Saanmuganathan, the Malaysian record holder in athletics' men's 3000m steeplechase, led the athletes' oath taking ceremony.

Spectators were also treated to colourful performances titled "Colours of Penang", which included the Games theme song "Beyond the Games" performed by the Penang-born singer Dasha Logan. Rain towards the end of the ceremony failed to dampen the spirit of everyone present, as the proceedings ended with an extravagant firework display which lit up the George Town skyline.

An estimated crowd of 1,500 people, mostly Games participants, turned up for the Asia Pacific Masters Games (APMG) 2018 closing ceremony held at the Setia SPICE Convention Centre on 15 September 2018. It was an impressive turnout as there was a thunderstorm in Penang on that day and many participants had completed their competitions before the final day of the Games.

The ceremony could not be held at the originally planned location at the Setia SPICE Convention Centre Rooftop Garden open air venue, due to heavy rain and thunderstorm. Due to guests' safety, a decision was made by the closing ceremony committee 30 minutes before the scheduled 7.30pm start to switch location to the Setia SPICE Ballroom within the same building. Due to the contingency plan for an indoor ceremony already in place, the location switch was done seamlessly and the closing programme went on without a hitch.

Among those present at the ceremony included the Penang Chief Minister Mr. Chow Kon Yeow and the International Masters Games Association president Mr. Kai Holm.

The ceremony ended with the traditional Malaysian Joget Lambak dance accompanied by the APMG 2018 Boria song. Almost all the guests joined in during the final performance before the closing ceremony ended at 11pm.

For the first time in the history of the Masters Games, an official Torch Run was organised. The Asia Pacific Masters Games (APMG) 2018 Torch Run was organised by the Penang Island City Council (MBPP) with the assistance of MALA (Malaysian Association of Local Authorities) and the APMG 2018 Penang organising committee.

The run, which covered 3,908 km throughout all the 13 states and the Federal Territories of Labuan and Putrajaya in Malaysia, took 99 days to complete. The APMG 2018 Torch Run began at sunset from the Tip of Borneo in Kudat, Sabah on 28 April 2018 and finished at the City Stadium, Penang for the APMG 2018 Opening Ceremony on 8 September 2018.

More than 100,000 participants from various ages took part in the APMG 2018 Torch Run. The APMG Torch was carried by various means – on foot, motorcycles, superbikes, cars, boats, paraglides, on horseback and even by swimming across the sea during the Penang Channel crossing on 2 September 2018.

The APMG 2018 Torch Run officially went into the record books when it was recognised and accepted by the Malaysian Book of Records as the first torch run to be held for a Masters Games in Malaysia.



APMG 2018 Opening Ceremony Run

The Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 Opening Ceremony Run was held in conjunction with the Games' opening ceremony on the 8th September 2018 at the Penang City Stadium. An estimated 1,500 participants took part in the run. The run was not constricted to participants of Masters age, and was opened to all.

The 5km Opening Ceremony Run began from the City Hall, Esplanade (Padang Kota Lama), a seafront location in George Town. The run went through the heart of the George Town UNESCO World Heritage Site before ending at the Penang City Stadium, the oldest stadium in Malaysia built in 1932.

Participants of the Opening Ceremony Run reached the Penang City Stadium in time to catch the start of the APMG 2018 Opening Ceremony.

Games Headquarters

The Penang City Stadium functioned as the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 headquarters since the organising committee was set up in early 2017.

The offices on the 1st floor of the stadium, previously occupied by the Penang Island City Council (MBPP)'s Community Services Department, became the nerve centre for the operations of the Games working committee.

The organising committee had to temporarily relocate to the MBPP Beach Street Parking Complex in November after damage to the City Stadium's power supply generator after the November 4 2017 floods caused by a passing typhoon. The oldest stadium in Malaysia resumed as the Games headquarters in April 2018 after a new power generator and water supply was restored.

During the Games, the City Stadium also functioned as the venue for both the Opening Ceremony on September 8 and the Athletics' Track and Field events, which were held from 7-15 September.

Besides being the centre for all administrative aspects of the Games operations, the City Stadium was the general information hub for the Games providing resources and information to the participants, officials and the public.

The finance and Corporate Services division supported the operations of all other divisions through the provision of the following services:

The office space for the Games headquarters was provided by MBPP while MSNPP seconded its staff to the organising committee.

Travel & Accommodation

With the assistance of Penang Convention & Exhibition Bureau (PCEB), Apollo Holidays Malaysia Sdn Bhd was appointed in 2017 to provide an accommodation search engine for APMG 2018.

The accommodation search engine was integrated into the APMG 2018 official website and began taking bookings from June 2017.

With the support of Malaysian Association of Hotels (MAH) Penang branch, the APMG 2018 organisers received pledges from the MAH members to provide competitive prices for their respective accommodations to be put up on the APMG 2018 search engine.

It has to be noted that while participants were encouraged to make their bookings through the APMG 2018 website, many participants, especially Malaysians, made their own travel and lodging arrangements.

APMG 2018 also inked a partnership with the Malaysian Association of Tour & Travel Agents (MATTA), who were made the Games' Official Travel Partner. MATTA, with over 3100 registered travel and tour agents throughout Malaysia, were able to utilise their vast network of members and resources to cater to the travel and tour needs of the APMG 2018 participants. MATTA's record shows that a total of 145 Penang local tour packages were booked through the Official Travel Partner by the Games participants. The number does not include tour bookings made for travelling outside Penang.


The official Asia Pacific Masters Games Penang 2018 (APMG Penang 2018) website was launched in January 2017 with functionality added at regular intervals.

The website was integrated with the pre-registration system and information about the Games, Penang and Malaysia, so the user had a seamless experience when using these sections of the site.

From time to time the site was refreshed to make it more user-friendly and provide more information to potential participants as the Games drew closer. These include:

- the APMG 2018 Torch Run highlights
- listing of 22 sports and registration button
- updating the home page so a number of news items were visible
- rebuilding the menu, so that additional information could be provided for participants
- Facebook newsfeed
- special hotel deals
- updating the sport pages so they were able to display the results from the Sport page

The website was one of the primary tools for communicating information to participants, and visitation consistently grew as the Games approached. The site experienced extremely high visitation at the close of registrations in August, and then again during September.





Promotions Facebook

Facebook was utilised as the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018's main form of promotion on the social media.

Taking advantage of its vast popularity and reach across the globe, information, articles and promotional news and videos regarding the event, 22 sports contested and preparations for the Games were shared on the APMG 2018 Facebook page. Besides the Games, articles and videos to highlight attractions in Penang and Malaysia were also shared on the social media platform. The APMG 2018 organisers were actively engaged on Facebook to answer queries and to have a two-way communication with online users, who were mostly either active Masters Games participants or those that have registered for APMG 2018.

Since it was put up in early 2017, the total reach for the APMG 2018 Facebook page was 987,934 people and a total sum of RM11,534 was spent on the APMG 2018 Facebook ads campaign. Both statistics were obtained as at the start of the Games on 7 September 2018.

Executive Summary

Asia Pacific Masters Games (APMG) was hosted over a 9-day period in Penang Malaysia from September 7 to 15, 2018. In total, APMG 2018 was attended by 5,347 people, of which 3,587 were from outside Penang. International and domestic participants were accompanied by about 3,163 unregistered companions, which increases total visitors from outside Penang to 6,750. About RM 16.6 million was generated through expenditure on tourism by visitors from outside Penang.

The spending of international, domestic and Penang residents' visitors, along with the event operations expenditure had a tremendous economic impact on Penang and Malaysia. In total, increase in direct expenditure in Penang by these visitors is estimated to be about RM 17.5 million. In addition, approximately RM 10.2 million was spent in Penang through the organisation and delivery of the event. Hence, total spending associated with the APMG 2018 reached RM 27.7 million which is estimated to have contributed RM 49.9 million and RM 63.8 million to the economic activity or Gross Domestic Production (GDP) of Penang and Malaysia, respectively. The return on the state government's investment in APMG 2018 was about 616% which means that the government recovered each ringgit it invested in APMG 2018, plus an additional RM 6.2 of total cash inflow per ringgit invested. 

Penang Institute was commissioned by the APMG 2018 to estimate the economic impact of this event on Penang and Malaysia, at large. The assessment is based on survey data collected by Penang Institute and information provided by the APMG.

The general objective is to assess the economic impact to Penang as a result of staging the APMG 2018. The specific objectives are:

- To estimate the income generated in Penang tourism industry by APMG 2018; and
- To measure the contribution APMG 2018 made to the GDP of Penang and Malaysia.

A total of 5,601 people (comprising athletes, supporters and Non-Playing Officials (NPOs)) registered for the APMG 2018 including 2,273 international, 1,532 domestic/non-Penang residents and 1,796 Penang residents. Out of this number, about 5,347 people attended the Games and 254 were absent. Below indicates APMG 2018 attendance by nationality.



Source of Data

Face-to-face survey was conducted by trained interviewers during the event at corresponding venues. Only competitors, NPOs and supporters were invited to complete the survey. With 5,347 attendees, a total of about 1,627 survey forms, with 2 invalid answers (a rejection of 0.12%) were filled in. With 95% confidence level, the margin of error is estimated to be 2%. A stratified random sampling method was adopted to ensure that the sample collected reflects the actual population distribution and to reduce the sampling error. The composition of the sample is shown in Table 2. The survey captured important information on visitors' origin, length of stay, expenditure patterns and their feedback on APMG 2018 and Penang.

Methodology Adopted

The economic impact of the event was assessed by estimating the direct expenditure of those people who visited Penang because of the APMG 2018. The key elements of economic impact assessment of the event comprise spending made by visitors and event organiser. Visitor spending refers to additional expenditure made by event-related attendees. In fact, visitor spending forms the major component of economic impact. However, the organiser spending in staging the event can also generate additional income into the economy of Penang.

The direct impact of visitors includes expenditure associated with those domestic and international visitors who specifically came to Penang for APMG 2018; and those visitors who extended their stay in Penang because of the event. Expenditure by Penang residents, who attended the Games, is also included in our assessment.

The impact of event organiser spending or event operations expenditure considers the source of revenue earned from registration fees, government grant, sponsorship and others as well as the other expenditure accrued when staging the event. This is in fact the amount of revenue that spent in Penang. The information regarding the event operational budget was provided by the APMG 2018 organiser.


The multiplier concept was applied to determine the total economic impact of the Games. The basic model used to derive multiplier is the economic base model¹, which is specified as:

$$M=1/(1-MPC)$$

Where M= the multiplier, and MPC=the marginal propensity to consumer

Survey results

About 43.9% of the total sample are Penang residents, followed by 35.9% of international visitors and the remaining are the travellers from other states in Malaysia. Although competitors made up the larger share in overall as compared to the non-competitors, only 39% of Penang residents were participating in the games. Of all the non-competitors who were surveyed, family members of the athletes had the largest share of 41% for the international cohort whereas the majority of the Penang residents interviewed were the visitors who came to watch the Games which comprised 36.2%. Almost half of the international visitors hailed from India, Australia and Singapore, contributing 18.4%, 16.5% and 8.6% respectively to the total (Figure 4). On the other hand, attendees from Kuala Lumpur topped the domestic list, with nearly 30% of the total.

For the international and domestic visitors, additional questions on whether anyone accompanied them for the trip, number of accompany and how many of them were not registered with the APMG 2018 were asked. This information can be used to determine the overall number of non-registered visitors who came to Penang, no matter whether they attended the APMG 2018 or not. About 96.5% of international and domestic visitors stated that they visited Penang specifically for the Games, while the remaining 3.5% extended their stay in Penang because of the Games.

The survey result indicates that about 18% of the respondents came to Penang on their own, 60% of which were foreigners. Over half of the respondents came with friends or team members while about 26% came with their family members. Of these groups, most of them travelled along with 1-4 accompanies (Figure 7).

Table 4 shows the average number of unregistered accompanying persons per attendees². Based on the survey data, an average of 0.8 people per attendee were identified as unregistered companions. It was estimated based on responses to a question in the survey that asked attendees how many people accompanied them on their trip to Penang and how many of them are not registered. On average, 0.8 and 1.0 unregistered accompanying persons were identified for each international and domestic attendee, respectively. A total of 3,587 international and domestic visitors attended the Games. These people were accompanied by about 3,163 unregistered companions, which increases total international and domestic visitors to 6,750.

Economic Impact of the APMG 2018

The estimated economic impact of the Games refers to the direct impact. It captures the spending increase by visitors that is attributable to the event being staged in Penang, as well as event operations impact.

Visitor Expenditure

The direct impact of visitors includes expenditure associated with the total spending generated by international, domestic and Penang residents who attended the Games, plus unregistered companions. Table 8 shows the estimated increase in direct expenditure by visitors in Penang. Results show that RM 16.6 million was generated through expenditure on tourism by visitors from outside Penang. In total, increase in direct expenditure in Penang by international, domestic and Penang residents' visitors is estimated to be about RM 17.5 million.

Event Operations

The event operations impact considers the source of revenue earned, and the location of expenditure incurred by event organizer when staging the event. The total revenue generated from the APMG 2018 was RM 11,439,653.2, while expenditure associated with staging the Games equated to RM 8,086,097.90 (Table 9). The total revenue was sourced from federal and state government grants, sponsorship, registration fees, participation packages (agencies and ADUNs), opening ceremony run, road race and miscellaneous. About 89.3% of the total income was spent within Penang on administration, assets, games operation, marketing and promotion, sport operation and miscellaneous and the remaining 10.7% was spent outside Penang on IMGA fees, processing fee, royalty fee as well as marketing and promotion. APMG 2018 therefore created an inflow of money into the Penang economy of about RM 10.2 million⁴ through event operations.

Contribution to GDP and return on government expenditure

The inflow of money into the Penang economy of approximately RM 27.5 million caused by APMG 2018 is estimated to have contributed about RM 49.4 million and RM 63.2 million to the GDP of Penang and Malaysia, respectively. This is based on Penang and national GDP multipliers of 1.8 and 2.3, which was calculated by using the economic base model. The state government contributed RM 4.5 million to the delivery of the event which is considered to be government expenditure in APMG 2018. The return on government's expenditure in APMG 2018 was about 616.1% which means that the government recovered each ringgit it invested in APMG 2018, plus an additional RM 6.2 of total cash inflow (RM 11 of state GDP) per ringgit invested (Table 10).



Collaboration with Rapid Penang

The APMG 2018 Penang organisers collaborated with Rapid Penang in providing free public transportation for foreign participants through its wide network of buses plying throughout Penang (both on the island and the mainland) from 4th to 18th September 2018.

The transportation partnership enabled the participants not only to commute between their place of lodging and the competition venues, but also to enjoy the sights and attractions in Penang.

Foreign participants had a special logo of a bus on their APMG 2018 accreditation tags which entitled them to ride on Rapid Penang buses for free.

Response from the participants was good, as they found it convenient to use Rapid Penang services to commute between their places of accommodation and competition venue.

Apart from providing free public transportation to foreign participants during the Games, Rapid Penang provided 12 buses to transport participants from the Penang City Stadium to Esplanade during the Opening Ceremony on September 8.

Collaboration with GRAB

The ride-sharing service provider Grab provided a special promo code for the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018. The promo code, which enables the user RM 3 discount per ride, was reserved for the first 400 redemptions per day during the Games. The promo code was given out to all the participants during accreditation, together with the step-by-step instructions on how to download and use the Grab app.

The report from Grab shows that the promo code was extensively used on the 8th and 9th September, during the early part of the Games. Grab's recommendation in future is for the service to be publicised throughout the event to remind users of their discount privileges.

Registration System

The APMG 2018 online registration was launched on 28 October 2017. The APMG Organising Team was responsible for customising the online registration system, with support from system providers Fusesport.

The APMG Registration Team had monitored the registration and feedback from users. The team also managed and tweaked the system from time to time based on the feedback and complaints from the end users. Information and explanations on the steps needed to register, especially for the team sports registration, had to be given to avoid registration issues and grouses.

Apart from the online registration system, an offline registration option was made available to the participants, especially Malaysians. The offline option made it easier to receive bulk registrations, especially for those registering an entire team or taking up the corporate registration packages.

To encourage more local participation and to assist those who found it difficult to register online, offline team and walk-in registrations were accepted. The APMG 2018 walk-in registration counters were set up at three locations:

- Games headquarters at City Stadium
- Penang Island City Council information counter at Tun Abdul Razak Complex (KOMTAR)
- Seberang Perai Municipal Council Sports Club counter at MPSP Headquarters

The organisers and participants found the registration system provided by Fusesport as not user-friendly. Among the problems faced by participants were confusing team and partner-matching settings, and difficulties to search or invite partners within the system, especially for racquet sports like badminton, squash and tennis.

The organisers faced problems retrieving data from the master database for finance and user information purposes. The customer service support provided by Fusesport was restricted between 9am to 5pm Sydney time, which delayed prompt response whenever problems cropped up in Malaysia.

Late Acceptance of Registrations

The initial closing date for registration was set at 31 July 2018. However, a one-week extension was given to allow late minute registrations with the closing date fixed at 7 August 2018, exactly one month before the start of the APMG 2018.

While the registrations for most sports closed on 7 August 2018, late entries were still accepted for certain sports like the athletics' road races and cycling events, which does not require the organisers to prepare tournament draws or fixtures.

More than 40% of the total number of participants for the Games registered after the initial closing date. The late registrations contributed towards surpassing the 5,000 participants target. The final number of 5,601 participants was reached when registrations were finally closed on 31 August 2018, just one week before the start of the Games.

However, the late registrations caused discrepancies in the draws and pairings for the sports competitions. Late registrations with incomplete or wrong information provided by participants were not able to be checked or rectified in time by the organisers. This caused problems during accreditation and when the tournament draws and partners are determined in the respective sports.

Penang has been initiating 'Green Movement' for a long time. In conjunction to the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018, Penang is taking yet another step in saving the earth by making this event a Green Sports Event. With the support from Polyseed SEV, there were several environmentally friendly programmes such as plogging and food composting to minimize waste during the events. By doing so, APMG 2018 aimed to start a wave of culture to reduce, reuse, recycle and return wastes to mother nature. Awareness and educational banners were set up at a few main games venue to create awareness of plogging. To encourage the use of bio-degradable plastic, Polyseed SEV has provided bio-degradable laundry bag to every participant. Plogging bio-degradable plastic bags were being used at main games venue.

The success of the team in surpassing the recruitment target of 5,000 was a key achievement and can be attributed to the plan that escalated in early 2018.

The total registration figure of 5,601 participants, of which 5,269 were athletes and the remainder non-playing officials and supporters was an accomplishment for an inaugural event.

The attraction of a high number of international competitors (2,246), especially from Asia, where such an event has not been held before, was a terrific result.

Participants Recruitment

The recruitment of participants was the key activity for the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018. Various marketing and promotion activities were planned and executed to attract participants to sign up for the Games in Penang. The official registration period commenced in October 2017, but the marketing and promotion activities began in February 2017. The promotion campaign can be divided into three phases: pre-registration awareness, building interest and converting interest into registrations.

Analysis was conducted on registration figures from previous Masters Games and expressions of interest to prioritise marketing activities based on the sports and countries from which there was a higher expectation of securing competitors. Since the APMG 2018 was the first-ever Masters Games to be held in Asia, particular emphasis was placed in sourcing participants from the region, especially host country Malaysia and the next World Masters Games host Japan.

The strategy was a hit in attracting participants from countries like Singapore, India, China, Japan, South Korea, Hong Kong and Australia. But for some reason, the amount of interest and registration expected from countries like Thailand, Indonesia, Vietnam and even New Zealand, the hosts of the previous World Masters Games in 2017.

It was a surprise to get a positive response and a good number of participants from countries which were initially not part of the promotion plan like Russia, Mongolia, South Africa and Sri Lanka.

Overall, despite the challenge of creating awareness about APMG 2018 in Penang and educating Asians from the scratch about Masters Games, the recruitment process succeeded in surpassing the target of attracting 5,000 participants for the Games.

Reaching Out & Educate

The recruitment process for the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 was different from other previous Masters Games in the sense that awareness regarding a multi-sport Masters competition was minimal.

With the exception of certain countries like Japan and India, not many people in the Asian region was aware that they are able to compete in an international Masters Games without any qualifying or selection processes.

It was necessary, and important for the APMG 2018 to reach out to the masses and educate them on the Masters Games concept and their chance to enter and compete in an international sporting event. Presentations and roadshows done both locally and internationally were the most commonly utilised methods to provide information regarding the Masters Games in general, and APMG 2018 in particular.

The Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 was a first of its kind event in Asia. But there were Masters single sports events held regularly in the region. There is an existing market of Asian Masters athletes who take part in such events both in Asia and other parts of the world.

It was important to tap and attract these group of regular Masters participants to compete in Penang. Promotions at Masters sports events, both local and international, as well as an active presence in the social media allowed the APMG 2018 organisers to disseminate direct information about the Games to the target audience.

Being in direct contact with Masters regulars also allowed two-way interaction with the athletes. This enabled the organisers to utilise the Masters regulars to reach out and inform their friends, families and other sports-related contacts regarding the Games in Penang.

Direct approach to the existing Masters athletes proved successful in attracting participants registrations to the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018.

To generate awareness and to generate potential registrations for APMG Penang 2018, the APMG Penang 2018 Organising Committee implemented a radio advertisement campaign with Astro Radio Sdn Bhd. Astro Radio is the No.1 radio network in Malaysia which manages 11 radio stations that are broadcasted throughout the country.

Commercial airtime was carried out in three radio stations - Lite FM, Melody FM and Suria FM whose listeners match the demographics for Masters events. Media Centre & Accreditation

Media Centre

The Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 Media Centre was located at the Penang City Stadium, where the APMG 2018 organising committee offices are located.

The Penang City Stadium, the oldest stadium in Malaysia, also hosted the opening ceremony and the athletics' track and field programme for the Games.

The Media Centre was housed in the stadium's main meeting on the ground floor, and was equipped with wireless internet facilities for the working media.

Besides the general media, the Media Centre was also used as the operations centre for the Games' media volunteers.



Media Accreditation

Media accreditation registration opened to media a month prior to the start of the Games. The media accreditation form distributed to the media via e-mail.

Due to issues with the delay of preparing media accreditation passes the media passes were not able to be distributed as planned during the official APMG Media Briefing held at the media centre on September 5.

However, the media accreditation passes were ready on September 8 and were distributed to the media in time for the Games opening ceremony.

Media covering the Games events on September 6 and 7 were able to utilise their general media tags to enter the sporting venues and provide coverage of the Games.

Photography & Video

Internal and external personnel were utilised to provide photos and videos before and during the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018.

In the run-up to the Games, promotional videos were created to market and help provide both exposure and awareness to the event. Magic Lensa Productions was hired to shoot a series of sports and personality related videos, which were shared on the social media and through e-mails in the months leading up to the Games.

Videos on the APMG official song "Beyond the Games", messages from APMG main personalities and the APMG Torch Run were also created.

In addition to the promotion videos, a short movie clip featuring the official Games mascot CUN was prepared and used during the APMG opening and closing ceremonies on Sept 8 and 15 respectively.

A team of media volunteers was appointed to provide written and photographic coverage throughout the duration of the Games. Daily press releases were released to the media with highlights of the day, and heartwarming profile stories and photos. The provision of stories and photos on a regular basis ensured daily coverage on the broadcast media during the Games.

A team of photographers also delivered extensive photographs which captured the action and emotion throughout the Games, especially during the opening and closing ceremony events.

Media Volunteers and Press Releases

A media team was set up to provide coverage of the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 and to assist the working media.

The team, helmed by the APMG Publicity and Media Director and a Games Media Advisor, also consisted of seven media volunteers. The seven media volunteers were all journalism students from several tertiary institutions in Penang.

The volunteers, with the aid of the Media Director and Advisor, provided coverage of the Games from 6 - 16 September. The stories and photos sent by the volunteers from the various venues were edited at the Media Centre before being posted online on the Games official Facebook page.

Daily press releases which featured the highlights of the day and one top story were sent out by e-mail to the Malaysian working media (print and television) in Penang and Kuala Lumpur daily. The press releases included stories as well as photographs supplied by the media volunteers.

The daily press releases succeeded in increasing the coverage for the Games, especially in the local Malaysian print media.

Media Coverage Report

The Asia Pacific Masters Games (APMG) 2018 in Penang, Malaysia created history by becoming the first-ever Masters Games to have its opening ceremony beamed live on national television. The support from the Ministry of Communications and Multimedia and the Ministry of Youth and Sports was vital in securing the green light to air the opening ceremony live on the government-owned Radio Televisyen Malaysia (RTM)'s TV2 channel on Sept 8.

The national news agency Bernama was the most active supporter of APMG 2018, with daily news on their online site. The Penang-based Buletin Mutiara also provided planet of daily coverage on their online portal and the weekly publication.

The coverage from the English local print was a mixed response. The Star gave prominent coverage, with daily reports and a two-page spread of photos and write-up for the opening ceremony which appeared in the Star Metro (local community) section. The daily reports in The Star were mostly from the press releases sent by the Games organisers. The Malay Mail were supportive, with several write-ups. The biggest disappointment was the New Straits Times, which only covered the opening ceremony and the demise of an APMG football participant.

The coverage from the local Malay dailies was almost non-existent, with only the pre-Games news and the demise of the APMG football participant making it to print.



A total of 22 sports were contested during the inaugural Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018. All the sporting events were held at pre-existing venues and facilities in Penang.

The 22 sports selected for the APMG 2018 included the perennial Masters Games favourites like athletics, swimming, football, archery and volleyball. There were several Asian-themed sports appearing for the first time in a Masters Games such as Lion Dance, Wushu and Pencak Silat.

Tenpin Bowling, which has a huge following in the Asia Pacific region, also made its Masters Games debut in Penang, ahead of its likely inclusion in the World Masters Games 2021 in Kansai, Japan.

All the sporting competitions held during the APMG 2018 adhered to the standard befitting a major international Masters Games event.







Medical Report

The Medical Coverage Services team for APMG 2018 officially operated during the games from 5 to 16 September 2018. The main operations room was at the Penang City Stadium, which was the Games Headquarters. The main operations room had the strength of 10 persons operating as Main Secretariat Official/Personnel.

A total of more than 350 persons were involved as paramedic team members throughout the Games. The paramedics stationed in all the 22 sports venues include physicians, doctors, assistant medical officers, nurses, physiotherapists, first aiders and ambulance drivers. All the medical team members came from all over Malaysia from both the government and private sectors.

The 22 sports contested in APMG were classified with different risk assessments. The medical team strength and number of personnel involved are adjusted according to each sport's risk rating.

Low Risk Sports : Archery, Golf, Bowling, Squash, Table Tennis & Shooting
 Medium Risk Sports : Badminton, Netball, Beach and Indoor Volleyball, Basketball, Tennis, Swimming, Softball, Lion Dance, Wushu & Weightlifting
 High Risk Sports : Taekwondo, Pencak Silat, Hockey, Football, Athletics & Cycling

A total of 467 cases were reported being seen by the medical team throughout the duration of the Games. However, the exact number of cases is more as low risk sports cases were not reported and several other cases seen may have been unrecorded.

A total number of 29 cases were referred out. The hospitals involved were Pantai Hospital, Lam Wah Ee Hospital, Hospital Pulau Pinang, Hospital Balik Pulau & Hospital Seberang Jaya. Several cases were also referred to general practitioners/physiotherapists/own choice of hospital (for non-urgent cases).

Anti-Doping

For the Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018, anti-doping tests were conducted by the Anti-Doping Agency of Malaysia (ADAMAS) with the assistance of the APMG medical team. The tests were performed on five randomly selected APMG athletes from various sports and country. The selection process was done by ADAMAS.

The five tests were carried out by ADAMAS doping control officers on 9th September 2018. The test samples were analysed for the existence of prohibited substances and methods in an ADAMS (World Anti-Doping Agency)-approved laboratory in India.

The results of all five tests turned out negative, thus no further action is required. ADAMAS and the APMG organisers and medical team undertook the random anti-doping testing to ensure the integrity of Games is upheld and to strive for fair and healthy competition in the spirit of pure performance.

Medal Ceremonies

Medal ceremonies were held immediately following the completion of an event and the official results have been announced. A special sub-committee for the medal ceremonies was appointed for each of the 22 sports to plan and execute the medal ceremonies during the respective competitions. A total of 5,846 podium medals (gold, silver and bronze) and 1,180 finisher medals (for cycling and athletics' road race events) were presented for every event and every age group category throughout the Games.

The Asia Pacific Masters Games 2018 Official Merchandiser Syarikat Sanyu Sdn Bhd supplied all the medals for the Games.







Registration by Sports




